Write Offs and State Set Offs By Doug Craig, State of Kansas

The setoff program began in early 1981 following legislation that allowed the Director of Accounts and Reports to set off moneys the State of Kansas owes debtors against moneys owed to the State of Kansas. The program has provided a valuable benefit to state agencies by assisting them in the collection of their delinquent accounts receivables and in turn providing new revenue at a very small cost. In 1993, this benefit also became available to municipalities and in 1997 for the district courts. Participation in the Setoff Program is voluntary.

November 2010 Garden Tips

Dig dahlia tubers and store in dry soil. In cold regions mulch roses and protect winter veggie crops. Work bonemeal into soil before planting spring flowering bulbs. Force bulbs for indoor use. Prune deciduous shrubs. Winterize irrigation system.
