ARTICLE THREE, continued

- A. To foster and promote standards of professional preparation for, and the appointment, effectiveness, recognition, and association of student financial aid administrators and counselors in institutions of higher education and other public and private agencies and organizations concerned with or engaged in the support and/or administration of student financial aid.
- B. To serve the needs and interests of students, faculties, and administrations of institutions of higher education and of individuals and public and private agencies and organizations concerned with or engaged in the support and/or administration of student financial aid by promoting and facilitating coordination of student financial aid plans and programs, and by advising and assisting them in the promotion and development of effective programs of student financial aids.
- C. To promote and facilitate communications between institutions of higher education and the sponsors of student aid funds.
- D. To stimulate, promote, and conduct systematic studies and research, cooperative experiments, education, conferences, and other related activities as are desirable or necessary in fulfilling the purposes of the Association.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these articles. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended.

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court in the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
